- Physical skills and well-being
- Creative expression

First Day of School

While some children can't wait to start school, the prospect of leaving the comforts of home, learning new rules and adjusting to a new routine can leave others feeling anxious or worried.

For a smooth transition to Kindergarten, here are a few tips to put your child at ease before the big day.

- Encourage your child to share their feelings. Talk about all the new things they will get to do in Kindergarten and how exciting that will be.
- **Practice riding the bus.** Register for Edmonton Public Schools' annual First Riders event in August so you and your child can become familiar with the bus riding experience and yellow bus safety.
- Take a school tour. Visit a school open house or make an appointment to meet your child's teacher.
- Establish a school routine. Help your child adapt to their school schedule by going to bed at an appropriate time at least two weeks before the first day of school.
- Read books about school. The library will have many titles to choose from.
- **Encourage friendships.** Teach your child ways to make friends and try to introduce them to a classmate before the first day of school.

Learn Through PLAY

Children are naturally curious and eager to learn about the world around them. Through play, they have the opportunity to discover, explore and be creative.

To help your child be successful in school, provide them with plenty of play time. Playing develops important skills and behaviours in early childhood.

Listed below are a just few fun activities that you and your child can do together.

- Read to your child every day—even if that means reading the same book more than 100 times. It takes more than 5,000 "reads" to become a reader.
- Ask your child about the books you read together, using questions like "Why did you like this story?", "Which story is your favourite?" and "What do you think is going to happen next?"
- Play board games, puzzles and card games like Go Fish.
- Get hands-on using Play-Doh, finger paints, beads and blocks, or bake together to keep your child busy and engaged.
- Visit the playground frequently so your child can meet other children and stay physically active.
- Provide art materials like crayons, paints, Play-Doh, scissors and paper to encourage their creative expression.
- Praise your child's drawings, paintings and writings, and put them up on the fridge or around the house to show you value their work.

ASSESSMENT

Throughout the Kindergarten year, your child's teacher will observe and record your child's learning and progress in relation to the expectations for the seven learning areas included in the Kindergarten Program Statement. The teacher will keep notes and use checklists to record observations. They will look not only at your child's work but also at the skills and strategies that your child uses. By observing your child many times in different situations, the teacher is better able to build a more complete assessment of your child's learning.

Information that the teacher gathers about each child is used in several ways. This information helps the teacher plan the learning environment and match learning activities to learning needs. The teacher is able to provide ongoing feedback to children to help them recognize what they know and are able to do, and to focus their efforts on more challenging activities.

Through oral or written reports, parent evenings, classroom visits and conferences, you and your child's teacher will exchange ideas and information, and you will learn more about your child's progress and achievements. In some Kindergarten programs, children participate in conferences with parents and the teacher. This experience allows children to reflect on and celebrate their learning and set future goals.

You play an integral role in your child's education by providing the encouragement and support he or she needs to succeed.

RESOURCES

Many Kindergarten programs have resources available for parents on a variety of topics, such as child development, discipline, parenting, health issues and community programs. The Kindergarten teacher and/or school principal may also suggest other places to look for information, such as libraries, local agencies or government offices.

Ready For School?

Parents often ask, "Can I help my child be ready for school?" Yes, you can. Check the list below to see ways you can help your child at home.

Encourage your child to:

- 1. Follow simple directions (helping mom and dad).
- 2. Finish small tasks (putting away toys, etc.).
- 3. Sit still for short periods of time.
- 4. Put away clothes, toys, books, etc.
- 5. Speak clearly (not baby talk) using simple sentences.
- 6. Say "please", "thank you" and "excuse me".
- 7. Use a tissue properly.
- 8. Wash and dry face and hands alone.
- 9. Attend to toilet necessities quietly and unassisted.
- 10. Put on, fasten and remove coats, hats, mittens, snowsuits and boots.
- 11. Begin to work on learning his/her full name, address and phone number and also other family members' names.
- 12. Know how to take turns and allow others to take theirs when playing games.
- 13. Practice colouring neatly.
- 14. Practice cutting and pasting.
- 15. Practice recognizing and printing own name.
- 16. Listen to picture books, short stories, nursery rhymes, etc.
- 17. Look at a picture and name things in it.
- 18. Recognize colours.
- 19. Let others speak without interrupting.
- 20. Listen to a very short story and tell what happened in it.
- 21. Say some nursery rhymes.
- 22. Tie shoelaces independently.
- 23. Open snack containers.

Kindergarten Immunization

Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis and Polio Booster Second dose Measles, Mumps and Rubella Vaccine

Immunizations protect your child from serious childhood diseases. Diseases spread more easily when children are together in a group. Ensure your child is protected from vaccine preventable diseases by having his/her immunizations up to date. Kindergarten immunizations are given at the Public Health Centres.

After their 4th birthday most children should have:

- A booster dose of DTaP-IPV (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio) vaccine,
- A second dose of MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccine,

If immunization is needed, call your local Public Health Centre for an appointment.
